*Vision 2047 for Divyangjan is an initiative to empower India's Specially Abled population to actively contribute to the nation's economic growth, ultimately achieving a \$1 Trillion contribution to the economy by the disability sector for the "Viksit Bharat" goal in 2047.*

The evolution of Vision 2047 for Divyangjan represents a significant milestone in the journey of Voice of SAP. It builds upon the foundation laid by Vision 2020, a bold initiative proposed in 2014 by the founders of VOSAP, who recognized the need to empower and uplift those often overlooked in society—the Specially Abled Individuals. Over the years, VOSAP diligently engaged with various stakeholders, learning from each interaction and gathering insights that would shape the path forward.

Drawing from the experiences, interactions with leading policy makers in India and insights gained from implementation of Vision 2020, VOSAP founders embarked on crafting a visionary roadmap for Vision 2047. Key elements of this vision include the goal of empowering 15% of India's Specially Abled population by re-positioning the disability sector as an "UNTAPPED" economic opportunity, advocating for economics of the disability sector.

Collaborations with the Government of India and non-profit organizations have played a crucial role in shaping Vision 2047. In depth understanding about the grass root landscape from these partnerships helped us develop an economic model stacking up each component with realistic assumptions to arrive at a \$1 Trillion goal.

Vision 2047 is built upon the first hand experience of the transformative power of assistive technology. Our assistive technology partners have enabled the access to essential tools and resources to Specially Abled People, empowering them to learn and earn, overcome constraints and unlock their full potential.

Vision 2047 is a testament to the founders' profound love for serving India, rooted in the spirit of patriotism with thought leadership around economics of disability, REPOSITIONING the Disability sector as an 'UNTAPPED' economic expansion opportunity with millions of new jobs, prosperity and happiness to millions of families.

We urge you to ponder on the details of this BIG and BOLD goal in this report and let us collectively chalk up the plan in 2024 that will make this happen. 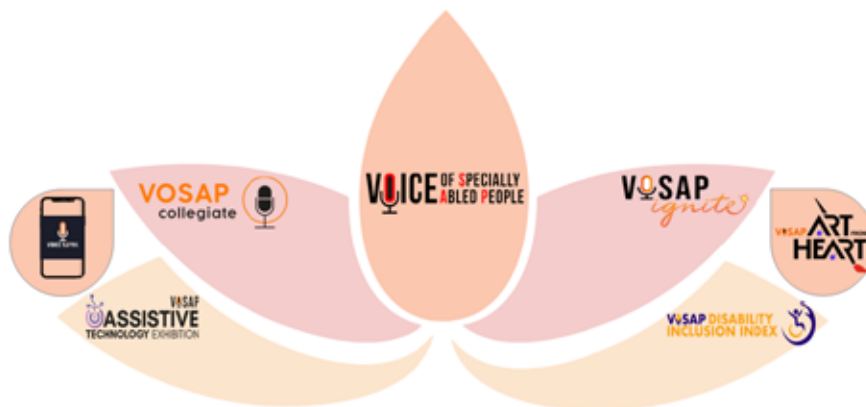

## VOSAP at United Nations in 2023

Voice of SAP is granted 'Special Consultative Status' with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and has been participating actively since 2019 at several sessions with VOSAP being selected to present statements 8 times at the United Nations.



### » VOSAP presented Oral Statement during High-level Political Forum at UN

- VOSAP was one of the 10 NGOs, selected out of ECOSOC NGOs from around the world, to present to world leaders, in person at the High-level Political Forum (HLPF) on Sustainable Development on July 20, 2023, at the UN Headquarters in New York.
- The statement's focus was on "Accelerating the recovery from the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) and the full implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development at all levels."

## VOSAP working with Governments

» **At G20 (C20), on Human Rights and Disability, VOSAP presented its collaborative model with AIC RMP**

VOSAP participated in the C20 Conference on Human Rights as Human Values, held on June 8 at Nalanda University in Bihar. VOSAP had the privilege of presenting the collaborative model, between the Civil Society and Incubators, which aims to promote innovations in the Assistive Technology Sector. VOSAP highlighted the potential for replicating this model in various G20 countries, with the goal of scaling up the innovation and adoption of assistive technology. By collectively integrating, empowering, enabling Persons with Disabilities into mainstream society, we aim to create significant improvements in human rights conditions.



» **VOSAP joined hands with International Purple Fest as a partner**

VOSAP proudly joined hands with the International Purple Fest Goa 2024 as its official International Partner, marking an important step towards collaboration with the State of Goa. More than a mere organizational alliance, this partnership symbolized a profound commitment to global solidarity, demonstrating our shared dedication to fostering a world where everyone, irrespective of disability, was afforded the opportunity to flourish.

The 7 days long festival included 9 different verticals such as a think tank to stimulate discussions on inclusivity, diverse entertainment showcasing the artistic prowess of Specially Abled Individuals, engaging exhibitions, and sports activities highlighting the abilities of athletes with diverse capabilities and a lot more.

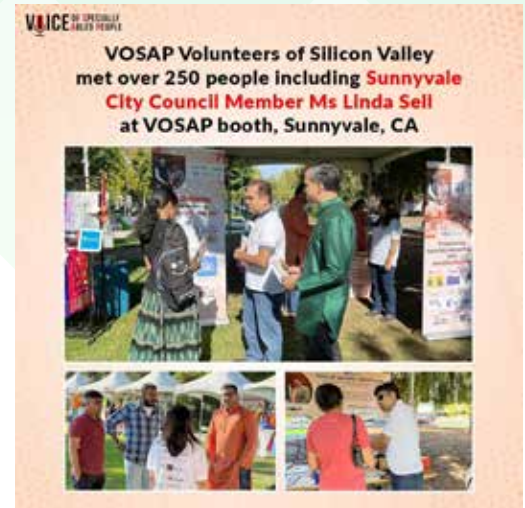
» **Meeting with US Congressmen and other US government dignitaries**

The movie's impactful message resonated with volunteers, donors at VOSAP charity screenings in Ahmedabad, San Jose, Los Angeles, and Virginia leading to successful fundraising for VOSAP. Lead Actor Arjav Trivedi, Producers and Director, Shri Vishal Bhatt, Shri Miral Shah and Shri Rakeshbhai joined during the special screening in Ahmedabad.

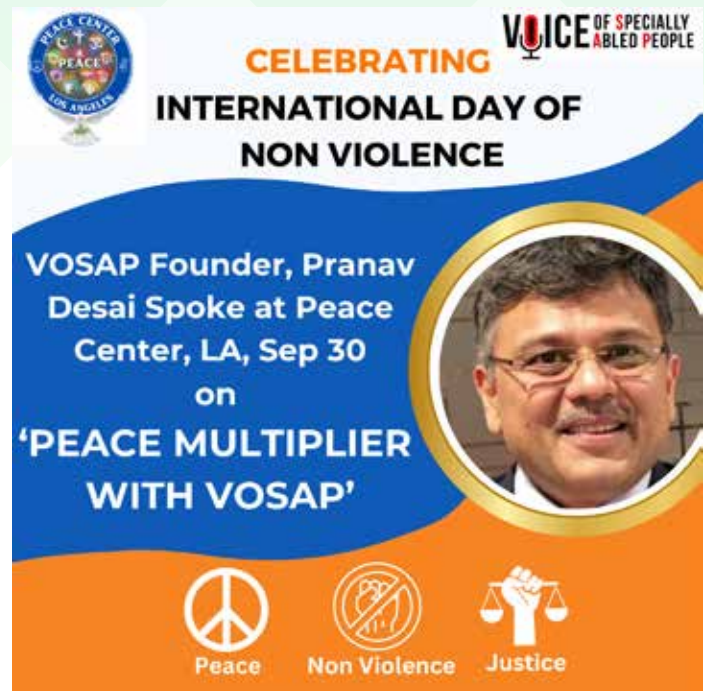

Together with her team, she embarked on an expedition to promote the inclusion of Specially Abled People. They first conquered the thrilling Kenya Safari Bike Ride adventure, raising awareness for mental health and self-discovery. Then, they scaled the 5,895-meter high summit of Mount Kilimanjaro, with the VOSAP Flag soaring as a powerful symbol of their mission. This trek showcased the incredible capabilities of Specially Abled People and the power of determination and community support in overcoming challenges.



## » *VOSAP Founder as Speaker at LA Peace Center*

On September 30th, in honor of the International Day of Non-Violence, the Peace Center in Los Angeles welcomed Mr. Pranav Desai as a distinguished speaker. In his speech Mr Desai articulated the key factors that disrupt our peace and elaborated how PwD live everyday of their life with many of those conditions, that takes away peace for them and family too. VOSAP brings hope, happiness with enablement initiatives that result in empowerment, thereby reducing stress and bringing peace to the entire family! He explained how engaging with PwD helps reduce stress of our volunteers, by understanding their magnitude of challenges that makes us count our blessings and then accept life situations and move on!



## » *Advocacy with Specially Abled Cricketers*

On October 30, 2023, “Sansad Khel Kud” hosted Divyang Cricket tournament at Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. VOSAP Team members joined the event in person to encourage and cheer the participants. VOSAP is very proud to collaborate with Dr. Karen Darke and Dr. Deepa Malik, both Paralympic Winners, to enable Para-athletes and Para sports in India.



## » *VOSAP Founder invited as Speaker at HSBC Bank*

VOSAP founder shared his inspiring life story with members of the ABILITY ERG (Employee Resource Group) at HSBC Bank, Singapore, commemorating the International Day of Persons with Disabilities. He presented ‘Triumph Over Adversity’, his journey of overcoming challenges and advocated for Inclusion and Diversity at HSBC Bank.



In 2023, our Enablement impact expanded to 19 states of India and 2 Union Territories and witnessed 180% growth compared to the year 2022 to cross 21,500 beneficiaries till Dec 2023. Every life enabled gives our volunteers, donors and of course each beneficiary and their family, tremendous happiness, satisfaction and hopes for what an Empowered life will do. Each of 3 sub-verticals of Enablement expanded in 2023 viz. Scholarships were given to students in Northern California, Cataract eye surgeries were conducted in Mathura and Ayodhya in Uttar Pradesh and our Assistive devices list added newer innovative products and were distributed to more states in India like Kerala.

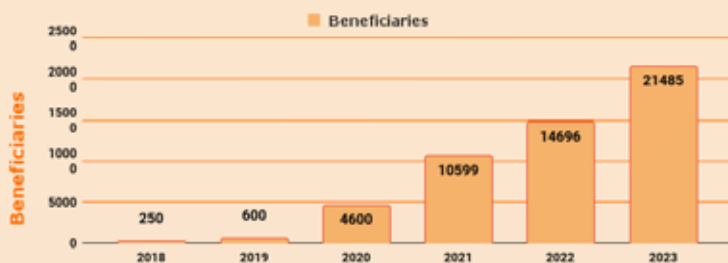

## Support with Surgical Interventions

Visual impairments and disabilities stemming from correctable conditions such as cataracts causing blurred vision or fractures limiting mobility, often leave individuals in India, without access to resources for treatment that is further made worse by financially poor conditions.

***In 2023, VOSAP enabled 4700+ beneficiaries with surgical interventions across India.***

- VOSAP expanded its 'Gift of Vision' program to Mathura with "Kalyanam Karoti Mathura" and Ayodhya with "Kalyanam Karoti Lucknow" to impact the lives of 1,762 beneficiaries from rural areas of Uttar Pradesh.
- VOSAP and Blind People's Association of India continue to strengthen our partnership with expanded scope of activities with excellent support of Dr Bhushan Punani, Nandini Raval and their team. They have made it possible to empower the lives in rural areas of Gujarat and surrounding states Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh with their state of the art facilities and equipment.
- VOSAP Operations Manager, Niyati visited Porecha Eye Hospital in Ahmedabad and Kalyanam Karoti Mathura to gain comprehensive understanding of the procedures, interact with beneficiaries on the ground, and witness firsthand the profound impact of the "Gift of Vision" program. These visits provided us with the opportunity to engage with the dedicated team overseeing the project, as well as professionals and doctors instrumental in its success. Listening to the personal stories of individuals involved was deeply moving, allowing us to forge meaningful connections and witness the joy in the smiling faces of patients. Connecting with patients on a personal level was an overwhelming and emotional experience, underscoring the profound significance of the work being done to transform lives through the "Gift of Vision" program.



## Enablement with Assistive Devices

The transformative role that Assistive Devices play in changing the life of a Specially Abled Person, providing opportunity to learn and earn is amazing and eye opening when we see what our Divyang brothers and sisters can do once they have the means to excel. With enablement initiatives VOSAP has helped transform 21,500+ lives by 2023.

In 2023, we expanded subsidy program with new devices from AT partners and exhibitors like Flexmotive Technologies (Crutches, CP Walker), Dhanvantri (Sahayatha Commode Wheelchair), Signable Communications (Sign language services app), Oneceptual technology (Handicare for respectful mobility) being added to Torchit (Smartcane), WeHear (patented Digital Hearing Aid), Trestle Labs (Kibo App and Kibo XS Device), to enable Specially Abled People with limited resources.

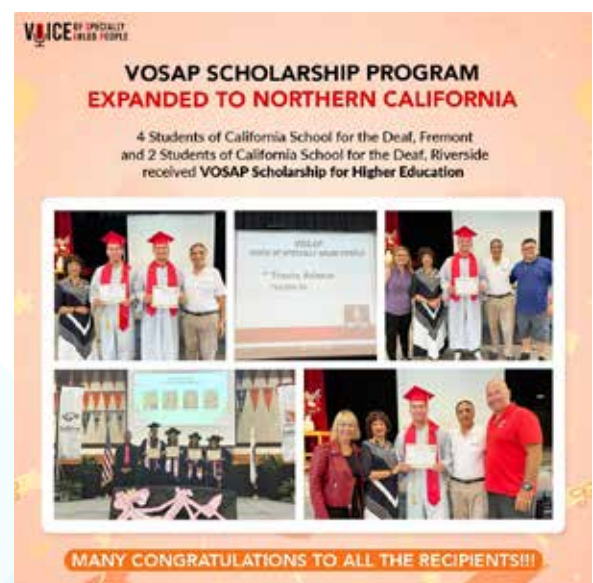


In addition to shipping devices to beneficiaries across India, VOSAP conducted 25+ mass enablement events at different locations. These events were graced by prominent local leaders like the Union Minister, MLA, Member of Parliament, District Collector, community leaders and local administrators. VOSAP is very thankful to its NGO partners across India to organize mass enablement events.

## Enablement with Scholarship

VOSAP Scholarship Program is aimed at offering financial support to economically constrained Specially Abled students in their pursuit of higher education in the US. The program extends assistance to graduating high school seniors intending to enroll in accredited community colleges, state colleges, vocational colleges, or universities. The scholarship covers tuition, books, and education fees, easing the financial burden for recipients.

Year 2023 saw an expansion of the scholarship program to Northern California. Notably, six Hearing Impaired students from Riverside Deaf School and Fremont Deaf School were the beneficiaries, receiving support through scholarships to pursue their college education. This expansion underscores VOSAP's commitment to fostering educational opportunities and empowering Specially Abled Individuals to realize their academic aspirations.





## Notable stories of lives transformed FOREVER

**Nandita Tripathi**, a 100% visually impaired, Assistant Government Pleader in Nagpur court, has transformed her work efficiency with the Kibo XS Device. This assistive device enables her to review documents, prepare legal paperwork in multiple languages, and significantly improve her productivity. Nandita's proficiency with the device has led to a notable increase in her monthly earnings, from merely Rs 10,000 to now reaching 40,000 rupees as she is able to take on more cases to prepare notes.



Her success underscores the transformative impact of innovative solutions in empowering individuals with disabilities to excel in their professions, showcasing the remarkable potential of assistive technology in breaking down barriers and fostering greater independence and success.

**Kevya Panchal**, a child with sensorineural hearing loss, underwent a remarkable transformation upon receiving a digital innovative hearing aid utilizing bone conduction technology. In a mere 60 days, he achieved significant milestones, starting to speak a few words even, speak small sentences, alphabets, and numbers. This rapid progress not only showcases Kevya's determination but also highlights the effectiveness of cutting-edge technology in facilitating the ability to hear and then speak, his communication skills. With newfound confidence and enhanced communication abilities surpassing his previous limitations, Kevya's journey serves as a testament to the transformative impact of innovative solutions in empowering individuals with hearing impairments to reach their full potential and thrive in their daily lives.

**Saraswatiben**, along with her two sisters from Renasar, Halvad, had lower body paralysis at age 13-14, leading to disabilities. Despite this, Saraswatiben found empowerment through embroidery work, earning 1500-2000 rupees per order. VOSAP provided them with a tricycle, wheelchair, and sewing machine, enabling mobility and an additional income of 400-500 rupees through pillow cover stitching. This support fostered economic independence and mobility to live a better life with dignity.





## Notable stories of lives transformed FOREVER

**Baraiya Ishvar Jadavbhai**, a 45-year-old with a locomotor disability, once earned a modest income cutting betel nuts. However, with the assistance of a tricycle provided by VOSAP, his opportunities expanded significantly. Now, Ishvarbhai visits the places, taking orders, and also delivers cut betel nuts, leading to a substantial increase in his monthly income. From earning a meager income, Ishvarbhai now brings in 2500-3000 rupees monthly, showcasing how VOSAP's support has not only improved his mobility but also transformed his financial prospects and quality of life.



**Bhagirathi**, the 100% blind son of a farmer and one of three 100% blind siblings from tribal Orissa, achieved a remarkable feat by passing the Orissa Public Service Commission (OPSC) examination. With the assistance of a VOSAP-subsidized Kibo XS Device, Bhagirathi overcame his limitations of visual impairment and could study well to become an assistant collector, earning over Rs 1 lac per month! His inspiring journey exemplifies the power of determination and innovative technology in breaking barriers and empowering individuals with disabilities to pursue their dreams and contribute meaningfully to society. Bhagirathi's achievement not only highlights his personal resilience but also serves as a beacon of hope and inspiration for others facing similar challenges.

**Raziya Banu**, 52, from Ahmedabad's Rakhiyal area, expressed heartfelt gratitude for the exceptional care received during her vision issues. A diabetic patient, she lauded the hospital staff for their attentive support throughout her treatment journey, from tests to surgery. Learning about Voice of SAP's impact, Raziya's gratitude overflowed, hugging in appreciation. She thanked donors for enabling transformative support, praying for their continued strength. Her touching gesture and words encapsulate the profound impact of compassionate care and support in empowering individuals like her to lead better lives.



**Lilaben**, a 30-year-old resident of Thasra village in Nadiad, found hope and relief through free eye surgery offered at the facility. Supporting her family of four through farming and labor, their monthly income barely reaches 6-7k, making surgery costs unaffordable. During our conversation, Lilaben's beaming smile radiated happiness and determination to continue her work. Her heartfelt request to keep in touch, expressing eagerness for future conversations, deeply touched us. Lilaben's resilience and gratitude exemplify the transformative impact of accessible healthcare and the enduring human connection that transcends barriers.

In 2023, VOSAP collaborated with Alpha Palliative Care in Thrissur, Kerala and provided essential assistive devices to the center for bedridden patients facing severe conditions due to disability, spinal cord injuries, and stroke. A total of 92 assistive devices, including wheelchairs, crutches, walkers, and commode wheelchairs, were provided. These devices play a crucial role in palliative care, offering 'Comprehensive to Total Care' support to patients in need. We express our heartfelt gratitude to Joy of Helping, USA, for facilitating this meaningful connection with Alpha Palliative Care Centre.



## VOSAP Youth Programs

Today's youth stand as the beating heart of the nation, embodying both its present vitality and its future promise. It's crucial to enrich their learning journey beyond formal education. VOSAP is dedicated to nurturing future leaders who champion the inclusion of Specially Abled People and cultivate compassion and empathy through volunteering. By inspiring our youth to become 'changemakers' in the communities, we envision a more inclusive future.

### » VOSAP Ignite Program for High School Students

The VOSAP Ignite program is a structured nine-month volunteering opportunity, where students actively engage in community service in a variety of initiatives with VOSAP. Igniters not only make a positive impact but also develop invaluable skills such as networking, problem-solving, leadership, teamwork, and empathy for Persons with Disabilities (PwD).

In 2023, we saw increased interest and formed 4 chapters in the US to enroll high school students from East/West/Central US regions. Also the second batch of VOSAP Ignite students (enrolled in 2022) completed over 2000+ hours of volunteering, showcasing their dedication to the VOSAP mission. Their contributions included rating public buildings, writing articles, fostering relationships with SAP students, organizing debate competitions and art competitions, conducting fundraisers, and spreading awareness in their schools and communities.

The Ignite Leadership Team is spearheaded by VOSAP founder Pranav Desai and consists of the National Coordinator for national level initiatives, VOSAP Regional leaders, who manage initiatives within their respective regions, timesheet approvers and support team who work collaboratively to drive the mission of VOSAP forward, ensuring impactful initiatives and fostering positive change in communities.



15 students received the prestigious "Presidential Volunteer Service Award" in the Ignite program so far with 8 receiving their PVSA in 2023.



## » **VOSAP Research Internship 2023 : Research at Data Sciences Department, UC Berkeley**

The VOSAP Collegiate program offers a unique opportunity for research interns to conduct studies on various disability-related topics, including policy, technology, government programs, accessibility, healthcare, and education.

VOSAP has collaborated with UC Berkeley's Data Sciences Department to conduct research projects in the field of disability since June 2020. This partnership has evolved into a strategic alliance with the Data Science Discovery Program in 2023.

In Fall semester of 2023, UC Berkeley students undertook a research project titled '*Trends in disability by birth defects, acquired disabilities and age-related disabilities in the United States.*' Detailed findings from this research study and the older studies can be explored on the VOSAP website, showcasing the program's commitment for data driven advocacy.



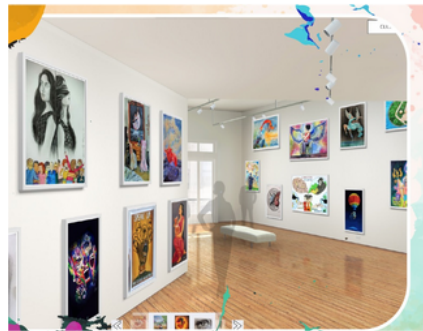
## Enabling scale and growing Impact Globally

→ Signable Communications (Sign language services app): Utilizing Video Remote Interpretation (VRI) and Video Relay Service (VRS), Signable Communications app delivers real-time interpretation in Indian Sign Language on simple touch.

→ Oneceptual technology (Handicare) : Handicare helps individuals with lower limb disabilities, providing them with a dignified means of movement and enhancing their independence.

→ Dhanvantri (Sahayatha Commode Wheelchair): 180 degree recliner wheelchair with defecation cleansing that provides a dignified and hygienic solution, minimizing reliance and promoting self-sufficiency.

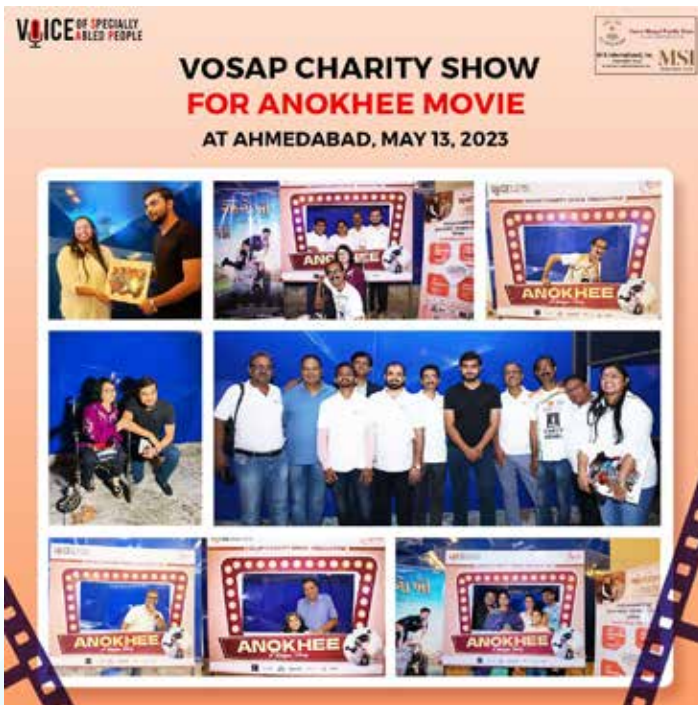

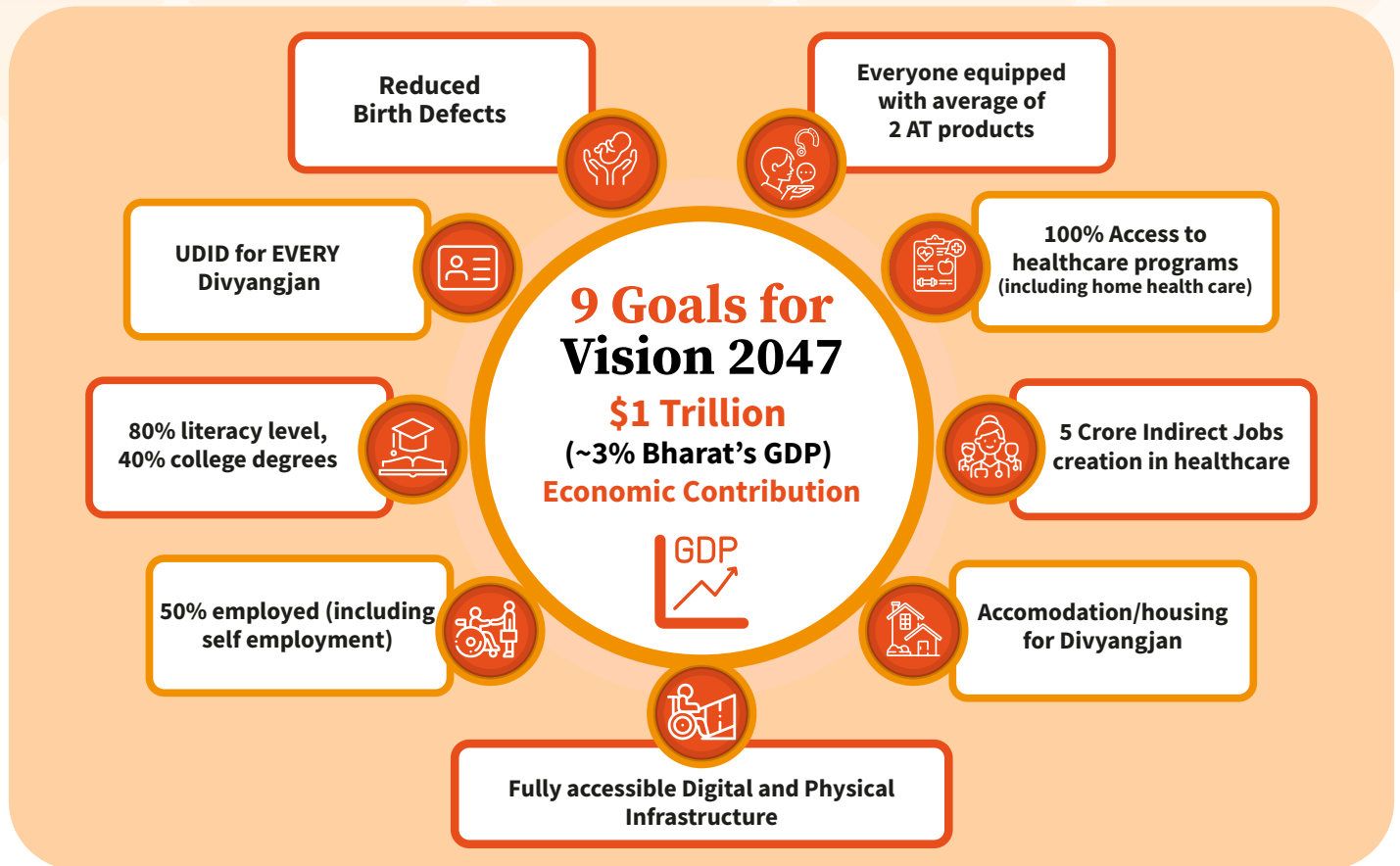

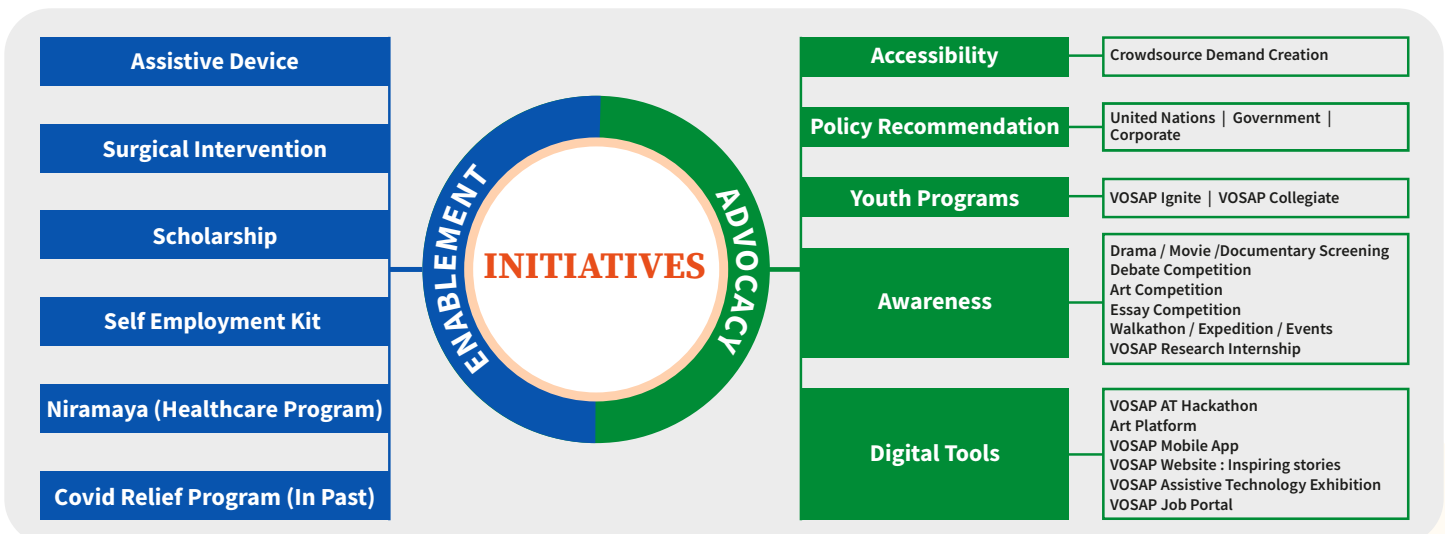
